# These happy adopters and their rescues will be spending their first Christmas together . . . .



It was the last cage on this last day in search of the perfect pup. The volunteer opened the cage door and the child carefully picked up the dog and held it closely. This time she took a little longer.

"Mom, that's it! I found the right puppy! He's the one! I know it!" she screamed with joy. "It's the puppy size!"


"But it's the same size as all the other puppies you held over the last few weeks," Mom said.

#### We always need foster homes for our dogs and cats . . . . Can you help?

It always seems odd to me that some Delta County residents want us to solve the problem of pet overpopulation, by taking in every stray dog and cat. But those same people don't want to be part of the solution. DCHS is an all-volunteer organization – we get paid, but only with doggie hugs and kisses, and kitty purrs and snuggles.

At the present time, we have six active foster homes, and yet we managed to adopt out 30 dogs and 41 cats so far this year. We could do more, with more people willing to become foster homes. I won't sugarcoat this responsibility – you need to be there for the animals 24/7 – you must be able to smile even when people give you a bad time – and be strong when caring for an abused animal, but it's all worth it when you find the perfect home for the animal that you are fostering.

Think about it, and if you want to become a foster parent, please call our phone number and leave your name and phone number. A member of our group will return your call and discuss qualifications for the job. If you love animals, you won't regret it, & you'll make new friends – both human & the 4-footed variety.






## Let's give a look at updates on previously adopted animals . . .




